Test God!?

Are we allowed to test God? We all recall Jesus' words to Satan as He was tempted in the desert: "Do not put the Lord, Your God, to the test." (*Matthew 4:7; Deuteronomy 6:16*) Is it ever okay to test God? There is at least one area of our life as the people of God, in which He not only allows us to test Him but challenges us to do so: Tithes and offerings supporting the work and mission of His Church.

Money is always a touchy issue. This is especially true in times of inflation or a down economy. Money, we think, is the source—the vehicle—through which we get the things we need. While there is an element of truth to this, it can also become a false perception that leads people to put their trust in something other than God.

In reality, we get the things we need only by the gracious will of our Creator. That is not a license to sit around and do nothing. God wants us to work and be productive if we are able. We are reminded of Paul's admonition to the able-bodied but lazy: "The one who is not willing to work should not eat." (*II Thess. 3:10*). Yet, the reality is that hard work does not guarantee anything. For example, I met a lot of very hard working *and very poor* people in Guatemala. It is God who provides, through economic means, the money needed to "sustain this body and life" (*Small Catechism: 1st Article of Apostles' Creed*, p. 15). In reality, the money is all His. He generously gives it to us to use appropriately and to His glory.

For the Christian, this reality creates a 'testing' relationship between God and us regarding *His* money. God tests us in expecting all among us (with exemptions for the poor—*Deuteronomy 14:28-29*), to return 10% (a *tithe*=10%) to Him out of all that He has given us. This is a test for us: Will we trust that there will be enough to provide for us and our families? Will we do this even if it means that some of the luxuries we enjoy might have to be sacrificed as a result? Luxuries like <u>(fill in the blank)</u>? If we are tithing and giving to the mission of Christ's Church, there is nothing wrong with or sinful in spending money on any of the things we might put in that blank. However, if we enjoy these things while saying, "I would tithe, but I just can't afford it." Is that true or is it more a matter of priorities?

Words of Truth From an Unlikely Source

I remember listening to a sports radio talk show several years ago. The host cited the increase in ticket sales for *Major League Baseball* for the second year in a row. He marveled at the time of this increase because the country's economy had been in a recession. I remember his words like they were spoken yesterday...

"The reality is that people find money for the things that are important to them."

I remember crying out, "Amen!"

His observation is true and reason for Christians to pause. When it comes to supporting the mission of Christ, it is a test for each individual's walk of faith. "How will I spend *God*'s money?" (continues on p. 2)

When we faithfully give, we are testing God. And He delights in it. Listen to what God tells us in both the Old and New Testament about our tithes and offerings.

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." *Micah 3:10*

God's people were not tithing. He was displeased and knew the heart of the matter: They did not trust that God would provide. He challenged them to test Him.

St. Paul also writes to the New Testament Church,

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." *Il Corinthians 9:6-8*

"Test me!" says God. See if I won't prove to be trustworthy. See if I won't bless your tithe and provide what you need and then some. For faithful individuals and faithful congregations, God promises that blessings will abound.

We at St. John have financial challenges. As we consider the current state of our facilities, most especially our school building, challenges abound. Yet, it is also an opportunity for us to test our resolve and sacrifice for the sake of the mission of Christ at St. John and in the community of Chester.

Here's a great idea for us as individuals and as a church: Let's test God! Let's tithe and see how He will bless us. Let's commit to sacrificing self to contribute to Lutheran education and the work of His church through the school. Then let's see if God "will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." (*Micah 3:10*)

We are Celebrating LWML Sunday October 1st!!

On this weekend the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) at St. John invites the entire congregation to celebrate together as the Body of Christ under the theme "The King is Coming." We look forward to all praising the Lord for opportunities to share His message and love with people from all walks of life throughout our community and the world. Our mission statement reads – "As Lutheran Women in Mission, we joyfully proclaim Christ, support missions, and equip women to honor God by serving others." The Holy Spirit has been doing this for 80 years through the LWML nationally and here at St. John.



One way to accomplish those purposes is by donating coins and dollars in Mite Boxes. Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), Mite Boxes are intended for regular contributions of "mites" – offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars all across the U.S. that fund district and national mission grants.

Everyone is invited to bring their pennies, nickels, dimes, quarters, and dollars to put in the big Mite Box found in the narthex. Feel free to take a small one home and fill it regularly to bring back and share.

A group of seven of our own ladies from St. John were privileged to attend the LWML's 40th Biennial Convention held June 22-25 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Stewardship Corner

It's in the Way that You Use It

Consider the humble baseball bat. It is a simple tool designed for a complex task. The batter needs a tool that can consistently deliver force to a small ball which may be thrown at over 100 miles per hour, but which might also come slanting across the plate as a slow curve. For a game like this, the founders of baseball had to redesign the old cricket bat, which is more of a flat paddle. The tool had to fit the job.

But even a specially-designed tool can be used for a different purpose. It turns out that some years ago in England, the home of cricket, baseball bats suddenly started selling like hotcakes. What were folks across the pond doing with all those baseball bats? Using them as clubs in riots!

A tool can be used, and it can be misused. It's all in the way that you use it.

The same is true with the things of God. The Second Commandment states that we should "not misuse the name of the Lord." In the Small Catechism, Luther goes on to tell us exactly what this misuse is, as well as the proper use:

"We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks." (SC I)

The Lord has given us His name: He has placed it upon us in Holy Baptism and He has invited us to pray to Him as our Father. In this sense, the Lord's name is something for us to use. We should not misuse it ... and we should not fail to use it. The Pharisees of old were so afraid of misusing the name of God that they decided to simply never say the name of God (YHWH, Jehovah) at all! This non-use is just as bad as misuse. The Lord gives His gifts for our use.

A Christian steward is one who is called to use all of God's gifts for His purposes. This includes things like the Name of God, the Sacraments and the Word, and it also includes things like our family and friends, our talents and skills, our money and resources. Everything that God has given to you, He has given to you so that you may be blessed to use it for His kingdom.

It's all in the way that you use it!
